'127' Piccadilly was acquired by the Cavalry Club Committee in April 1890. The Club later acquired 125 and 126 Piccadilly. Work from 1907 to 1909 resulted in the Club House as it is today.

In 1975 the Club was merged with the Guards Club who brought some fine military pictures and silver and 800 members.

In 1984 threatened with eviction by a new owner, the Club bought the property in April 1987. Since then over £3 million has been invested in further improvements.



THE BRITISH CEMETERY, ELVAS, PORTUGAL

The British Cemetery was opened to receive the body of Major General Daniel Hoghton, Sir Bernard's ancestor, who was killed at the battle of Albuera on 16 May 1811.

Several further burials were made there, but only four have grave stones.

The Friends were formed in 1996 to care for the cemetery. In 2000 memorial plaques were unveiled to the regiments who fought at Albuera and the sieges of Badajoz.

Later the Chapel was restored at considerable expense and a small museum installed.

It is now a 'Must Visit' point for any Battlefield tour in the area.

In 2012, Elvas was finally recognised as a World Heritage and the Forte da Graça restored to its 18th Century glory.
